Your Therapist Counseling Services is seeking licensed mental health clinicians to serve individuals, families, and couples in Georgia. The applicant can be fully licensed, (LCSW, LMFT, LPC) or have a provisional license (LMSW, AMFT).

The mental health clinician is responsible to provide diagnostic assessments, therapy, and counseling and support services for a mixed caseload including adults, adolescents, and families experiencing mental health issues, marital challenges, or family conflict. This is an opportunity to work as part of a dynamic team, providing services to a broad spectrum of clients. The mental health clinician will be familiar with other services and resources in the community and work closely with them to provide information and support when required.

Responsibilities and Duties:

Facilitate therapy sessions with individuals, groups, or families.

Diagnose and treat mental health disorders.

Create individualized treatment plans according to client needs and circumstances.

Write progress notes after each session and client interaction using DAP format.

Monitor and document client progress during treatment through ongoing assessments.

Establish positive, trusting rapport.

Involve and advise family members, treatment team members, and/or collateral contacts when appropriate.

Refer clients to outside specialists or agencies when necessary.

Maintain thorough records of patient meetings and progress using EHR system.

Maintain client and practice confidentiality and privacy in accordance with HIPAA standards.

Reports to: Clinical Director of the practice.

***Note: This is a virtual position. Although virtual, this position requires the applicant to show up fully. ***

The mental health clinician must also maintain the highest levels of confidentiality and privacy of client and practice PII in accordance with HIPAA standards at all times.
